802OPPORTUNITY STUDENTS

- ✓ 802Opportunity students were more than twice as likely as other CCV students to graduate within four years, compared to students who were not 802Opportunity recipients (43.6% versus 19%)
- ✓ 802Opportunity students graduated from CCV and moved on to another learning institution at a higher rate (15.6%) than other CCV students (9.2%)
- ✓ 379 credentials were awarded to 802Opportunity students in academic year (AY) 23-24

Administered by VSAC on behalf of the State of Vermont, 802Opportunity allows any Vermont student with a family income of \$75K or less to attend the Community College of Vermont (CCV) **tuition free**.

To enroll in CCV using 802Opportunity, students need only complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the Vermont Grant application.

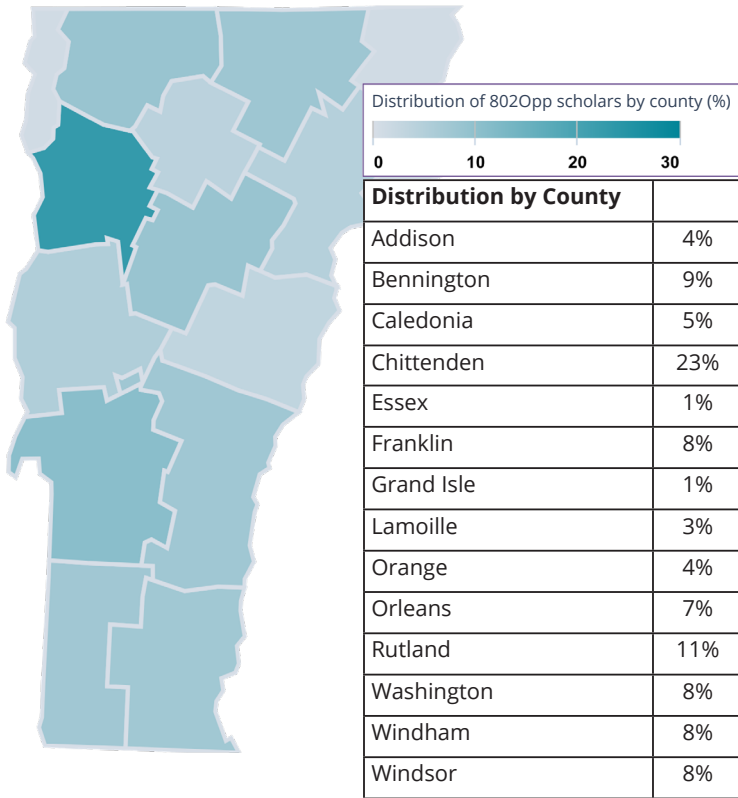

PROGRAM OUTCOMES

- ✓ CCV students borrowed 49% less in 23-24 than they did 20-21
- ✓ 23-24 Enrollment at CCV of Vermont's neediest students, those who are Pell-eligible, increased by 16% since 20-21
- ✓ In AY23-24 more than 2,600 Vermonters enrolled in CCV using 802Opportunity

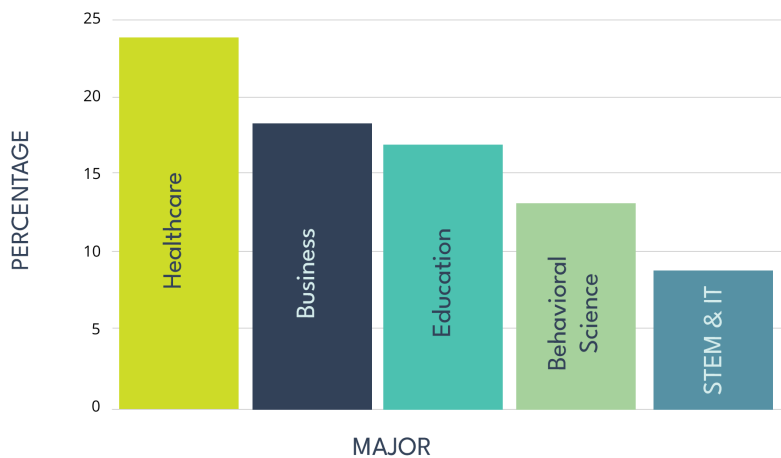

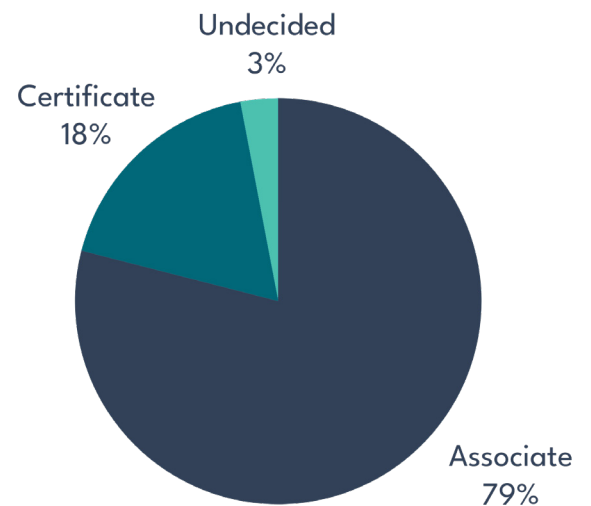
