

Vermont State GEAR UP

VSAC's Vermont State GEAR UP (VSGU) grant application summary

- Budget awarded: \$4,448,890 annually for sevenyears.
- · Proposed grant period: 2018-2025
- Students to be served: 2,500 in grades 7–12, plus 300 in first year of postsecondary education or training
- Number of schools to be served: 37

Eligible Students

Eligible students are either:

- from modest income backgrounds (eligible for FRL),
- first in their family to attend postsecondaryeducation/training,
- experiencing foster care (DCF),
- English language learners,
- experiencing homelessness (as designated by the school Homeless Coordinator),
- and/or have an incarcerated parent

GEAR UP and U.S. Department of Education objectives

- To increase the academic performance and preparation for postsecondary education of participating students.
- To increase the rate of high school graduation and participation in postsecondary education or training of participating students.
- To increase educational expectations for participating students and increase student and family knowledge of postsecondary education or training options, preparation, and financing.

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VSGU benefit to schools

First and foremost, VSGU assigns a dedicated and highly trained outreach counselor to each GEAR UP school. Our counselors provide group and individual information, support, and counseling on career and postsecondary readiness. Each counselor works closely with school personnel to provide access and opportunities to students.

- The opportunity to offer the new EMC² math class (see page 3) to boost the math competency of students so they can enroll in college at the Vermont State Colleges without the need for remediation.
- Access to VSGU's academic support coordinator who has extensive experience teaching and supporting math and other academic areas at all educational grade levels.



- Increased access to online courses through our partnership with VTVLC, including upperlevel math and science courses that may not currently be offered in the schools and Introduction to Online Learning for middle school students.
- Access to the College and Careers class and Middle School Access Days through our partnership with the Community College of Vermont.
- Support for work-based learning opportunities and access to the TIPS curriculum through our partnership with Careers CLiC.
- The opportunity to participate in VSGU organized college and career readiness events including Vermont Career Connect, STEM Fairs, and College & Career Pathways, plus VSGU's annual professional development event, the Transition & Career Planning Conference.

Support provided directly to schools

Through VSGU's Partnership Agreement process, schools can apply for funds annually to be spent in ways that benefit students, faculty, and staff, and align with GU objectives. The process is designed to be completed in partnership with the school principal, counseling staff, and faculty to best utilize the funding and address VSGU objectives.

Examples of funded initiatives that benefit students include:

- · college visits
- · career exploration and exposure
- · academic enrichment programs (out of school tutoring/homework clubs and math interventionists)
- financial literacy and financial knowledge

Examples of funded initiatives that benefit faculty and staff include:

- professional development, including conference attendance that builds capacity for student success
- equipment needed in classrooms to support teaching
 - computer software for assessment and support of STEM learning
 - · materials such as robots, life science kits, electronics kits, digital microscopes, maker space materials, etc.

VSGU has created a lending library of STEM manipulatives to provide access for students to robots, tangrams, spirograph kits, 3D puzzles, and neuroscience kits.

Additional VSGU support to Vermont students

VSGU students pursuing education after high school will receive a scholarship if they attend an institution or training program that accepts federal financial aid. Students are also eligible to receive financial assistance with the purchase of their textbooks during their post-secondary education or training.

GUIDE supports students during their senior year of high school, the summer before post-secondary enrollment, and through their first year of college. GUIDE staff provides one-on-one support from counselors in person, via email, video calls, and phone, and through a two-way text messaging system to support students in overcoming the barriers associated with getting from high school graduation through first year of post- secondary education or training.

VSAC's own research has demonstrated that GUIDE produces results. VSGU students who graduated from high school and enrolled in postsecondary education in 2013 were the first to be provided support through VSGU's GUIDE program.

- Of these students, 44% completed a two- or four-year degree, and another 25% were still enrolled in college four years after graduating from high school.
- · Comparatively, 29% of low-income Vermonters earned degrees within four years.

GUIDE's texting platform includes not only first-year postsecondary education/training students and their parents, but also high school seniors and their parents. Students and parents receive texts with helpfulreminders and resources throughout senioryear, summertransition, and through their first year after high school. The texting network also allows our students and parents to text a VSGU counselor questions about getting ready for and attending college. Postsecondary education/training students currently reach out for resources to navigate costs, complete the FAFSA, pay their bill, connect to campus supports, brainstorm issues, and find on-campus work.

Essential Math for College and Career (EMC2)

- A high school math course that has been collaboratively designed by VSGU with high school teachers, postsecondary faculty from the VSC system, and educators from the Vermont Agency of Education.
- The Vermont State College System (VSCS) has agreed that successful completion of this course will qualify students to enroll in credit bearing college math at any VSCS school without the need for remediation.
- Schools who pilot the course receive free professional development for two math teachers and mentor support throughout the year.
- Two-thirds of students who took the course during its pilot year said they would recommend the course to other students.
