VSAC Assisted Scholarship: Tips for Success

- Talking about finances can be uncomfortable. Take a deep breath and push on!
- Follow-through and don't be scared off by the competition.
- Don't let financial need requirements keep you from applying.
- Be sure your references **know you enough** to write something individualized.
- Make sure each scholarship is **worth the effort** (consider the size of the applicant pool when applying and make sure the amount of work needed to apply aligns with how much competition you're facing, along with the scholarship prize).
- Search thoroughly to be sure you qualify for the scholarship.
- Don't miss the deadline for submission/postmark deadline of **Wed., February 12, 2025.** All documents must be received by this deadline.

Middle School Parent Tips

Set Goals Together

- **Connect & Listen.** Ask questions. Set aside time to connect. Really ask questions that require more than a yes or no. Kids want to do more with their parents and connect. Listen more than you talk!
- **Reveal.** Share your own sense of purpose and passion for things that are important to you. Your energy and enthusiasm is contagious.
- Notice. Pay attention to the things your kids are interested in and what they spend time doing. How do the things they enjoy relate to their goals.
- **Coach.** Once you know their goals coach them and help them find things they can start doing now to help them move in that direction.
- **Highlight.** Share examples from friends, family, network, and community. Use good and challenging situations to share learning and growth.
- **Believe.** Be their cheerleader. Let them know you believe they are capable of doing hard things.

11th Grade Parent Tips Social Capital

Developmental relationships are essential to help young people discover how to become their best selves.

Young people do best when they experience strong, positive relationships in all parts of their lives. Research has found that young people who experience strong developmental relationships across different parts of their lives; home; school, community, jobs, interests such as clubs, sports, drama; art, are **more likely to show signs of positive development** and emerging responsibility and **reduced engagement in a variety of high-risk behaviors**.

Research also shows that nearly 40% of young people feel lonely. **Together we can help them connect.**
